Noun:	a word that represents a person, place, thing or idea
Pronoun:	a word that takes the place of a noun
Adjective:	a word that modifies a noun or pronoun, -Answers: <i>Which one? What kind? How much? How many?</i>
Verb:	word(s) expressing an action or a state of being
	<ul> <li>-Action verbs represent actions</li> <li>-Linking verbs connect the sentence's subject with an adjective or noun in predicate.</li> <li>-Helping verbs work with a main verb to create a verb phrase.</li> </ul>
Adverb:	a word that modifies a verb, adjective or adverb -Answers <i>How? Where? When? To what extent/why?</i>
Preposition:	word(s) that expresses a relationship between words -Always exists in a <i>phrase</i> , starting with the preposition and ending with its <i>object</i>
Conjunction:	word(s) used to connect words, phrases and clauses
Interjection:	words that express emotion or draw attention -Never grammatically connected to other words in the sentence
